### **Junior Midweek 7s – Safeguarding Policy**

# Our Commitment to Safeguarding

At Junior Midweek 7s, the welfare of every child and young person is our highest priority. We are committed to providing a safe, inclusive, and enjoyable football environment for all players, coaches, referees, and spectators.

#### We believe that:

- Every child should be respected, valued, and heard.
- Everyone involved in football has a duty to protect children's welfare.
- Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility.

#### To support this, we:

- Appoint a Designated Safeguarding Officer (DSO) for the league.
- Follow The FA's Safeguarding Children policies and procedures.
- Require all coaches, referees, and officials to have valid DBS checks and up-to-date safeguarding training.
- Promote a culture where children feel safe and supported.
- Respond swiftly and appropriately to any concerns or disclosures.
- Enforce clear codes of conduct for players, parents, coaches, and officials.
- Regularly review and strengthen our safeguarding practices.

# 1. Safeguarding Commitment

We are committed to providing a safe and positive environment for all young people involved in Junior Midweek 7s. We adhere to safeguarding best practices as outlined by **The FA**, the **NSPCC Child Protection in Sport Unit (CPSU)**, and current UK legislation.

## 2. Designated Safeguarding Officer (DSO)

The DSO is responsible for:

- Responding to safeguarding concerns or disclosures
- Liaising with The FA, County FA, and statutory authorities
- Ensuring all league staff and match officials follow safeguarding procedures
- Promoting a safe culture throughout the league

#### 3. Safer Recruitment

All league staff, referees, coaches, and team managers must:

- Hold a valid FA DBS (Disclosure & Barring Service) check
- Complete The FA's Safeguarding Children Course
- Provide references if required
- Understand and commit to safeguarding responsibilities

### 4. Code of Conduct

All participants and stakeholders must follow the Junior Midweek 7s Code of Conduct, which includes:

- Treating all children with respect and dignity
- Never engaging in inappropriate behaviour or communication
- Promoting fair play and positive behaviour
- Immediately reporting any concerns or incidents

## 5. Supervision & Matchday Safeguarding

- Each team must have a minimum of 1 registered club official present at every match.
- At least one adult per team must hold a valid DBS.
- One-on-one adult-child situations are **not permitted** without parental/guardian consent.
- First aid and emergency protocols must be in place and communicated before each fixture.

# 6. Photography & Media

- Photographs and videos may only be taken with parental consent.
- Images must never be used inappropriately or shared without permission.
- Player ID photos are strictly for registration and identification use only.

## 7. Managing Concerns & Disclosures

If a child makes a disclosure or you witness concerning behaviour:

- 1. Listen calmly and without judgment.
- 2. Do not promise confidentiality.

- 3. **Record details** including who was involved, what happened, when, and where.
- 4. **Report immediately** to the League DSO.
- 5. For serious/urgent issues, contact the County FA Safeguarding Officer or emergency services.

#### If a child is in immediate danger:

- Call **999** (Police)

### 8. Online Communication

- All league communication with players under 18 will go through parents/guardians only.
- No private messaging or direct contact with players on social media is permitted.

# 9. Data Protection & Confidentiality

- Safeguarding records are held securely and shared only when necessary with relevant authorities.
- We comply with UK GDPR and data protection regulations to protect children's personal data.

# 10. Policy Review

This policy and safeguarding procedures will be reviewed **annually**, or as necessary to remain aligned with The FA and UK safeguarding legislation.
